Members of the Legislature:

Your Joint Legislative Audit Committee respectfully submits the Auditor General's report No. 824 entitled, California Environmental Protection Program: Need for Discrete Program Objectives.

The report questions the wisdom of permanently dedicating personalized license plate revenue to a vaguely described purpose such as the preservation and protection of California's environment and making annual appropriations to contribute to the support of a loose federation of environmental activities. As personalized license plate revenues are appropriated for "support" they often lose their identity and become commingled with other funds. The absence of discrete objectives to be achieved by specific dates precludes program evaluation.

The Auditor General has made alternative suggestions to the Legislature concerning accountability of the California Environmental Protection Program.

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SUMMARY

The California Environmental Protection Program provides the means to channel one source of revenue, the net funds from the sale and renewal of personalized license plates, to a variety of environmental programs operated by state departments and agencies. Most of the funds are used for administrative costs and appropriations to support a variety of environmentally related activities. A small part, five percent in 1977-78, is used for discrete projects identified in the Budget Act.

The absence of discrete objectives for the California Environmental Protection Program precludes a comprehensive program evaluation. In addition, as funds are appropriated, they often lose their identity and become commingled with other funds. Ascertaining how CEPPF funds have been used and attempts to relate benefits to source of funds is thereby impeded.

INTRODUCTION

In response to a resolution of the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, we have conducted a review of the California Environmental Protection Program Fund (CEPPF). The purpose of our review was to determine the nature of expenditures from the personalized license plate revenues. This review was conducted under authority vested in the Auditor General by Section 10527 of the Government Code.

The Marks-Badham Environmental Protection and Research Act (Chapter 779, Statutes of 1970) established the CEPPF. The Act authorizes fees from the sale of personalized license plates to be deposited in the fund with the net revenue, after provision for administrative costs, to be used for the preservation and protection of California's environment, including, but not limited to, the control and abatement of air pollution generated by motor vehicles.

In addition to regular vehicle registration fees, personalized license plate holders pay an initial fee of \$25, an annual renewal fee of \$10 and a \$12 fee to transfer the plates to another vehicle. The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) collects these fees and deposits the revenue in the CEPPF. The costs incurred by the DMV related to the personalized plates are appropriated from the monies deposited in the fund. The balance of the fund is available for environmental purposes upon

appropriation by the Legislature. The Secretaries of the Resources and Business and Transportation Agencies are responsible for determining priorities and may recommend apportionments among various state and local agencies, the University of California and private research organizations.

We have compiled CEPPF financial data reported by the State Controller and state agencies as shown in Appendices A through C. These data were not audited by us and accordingly we do not express an opinion on them.

Total revenues through June 30, 1978 were \$24.6 million. After providing for the Department of Motor Vehicle's administrative costs of \$5.8 million, \$17.1 million was expended for environmental purposes and \$1.7 million remained unexpended as accumulated surplus at June 30, 1978.

Surplus Available
for Appropriation

As shown in Appendix B, surplus available for appropriation at year end since June 30, 1974 ranged from a high of \$2.8 million at June 30, 1974 to a low of \$862,000 at June 30, 1978. Revenues from license plates for the same period ranged from a low of \$2.4 million for the year ended June 30, 1974 to a high of \$5.3 million for the year ended June 30, 1978.

The relatively large surplus available for appropriation on year ends prior to June 30, 1978 indicates that in the past delays have occurred in the appropriation of available resources. However, the surplus available for appropriation at June 30, 1978 (\$862,000) was much smaller than in previous years, and for the 1978-79 fiscal year the Legislature appropriated \$6.4 million which is \$400,000 in excess of projected revenues from environmental license plates.

The Appropriation Process

Various state departments request appropriations of CEPFF monies. The requests, other than those of the Resources Agency, are first reviewed by the Department of Finance and then by the Resources Agency. The statutes provide that the Secretaries of the Resources and Business and Transportation Agencies are responsible for determining priorities. However, the Business and Transportation Agency has generally not participated in the review of CEPFF projects and appropriations for several years.

We are advised by the Resources Agency that a substantial portion of each year's revenue is allocated by the Department of Finance for ongoing programs. The Resources Agency has limited control over those allocations.

Conditions of Appropriations

The following Table I shows a summary of expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1978, segregating appropriations for administration and support* from appropriations for specific projects. Ninety-five percent of CEPFF expenditures were appropriations designated for administration or support.

* The Budget Act provides that whenever an appropriation is made for support it shall include salaries and all other proper expenses, including repairs and equipment.

The state accounting system generally does not identify the expenditures from specific funds contributing to the support of an agency or program. It is therefore not always possible to determine how specific contributing funds are used.

Although a separate accounting for most CEPPF appropriations is not required, some agencies report specific projects funded from the CEPPF. Schedules I and II at the end of this report provide a listing of specific projects for which CEPPF monies were reportedly expended.

AUDIT RESULTS

THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION PROGRAM LACKS DISCRETE PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Although termed a "program" and shown in the Governor's Budget as such, the Environmental Protection Program is, rather, a means to channel one source of revenue to a variety of environmental programs operated by numerous state departments and agencies. The net funds from sales of personalized license plates, after paying administrative costs of the Department of Motor Vehicles, are used to support other state programs, which have the usual characteristics of programs (i.e., related activities performed to achieve a definitive objective).

Since inception of the personalized license plate program in 1970, 17 state departments and agencies, including the State Assembly and the Board of Control, have received budget appropriations or augmentations from the California Environmental Protection Program Fund (CEPPF). Appendix B shows the expenditures of the CEPPF for fiscal years ended June 30, 1971 through 1978 by state agency. The following Table II shows the percentage of total expenditures by major agencies.

Expenditures of the Department of Motor Vehicles, the Department of Fish and Game and the Air Resources Board collectively account for 86.7 percent of expenditures for the year ended June 30, 1978.

CONCLUSION

The absence of discrete objectives for the California Environmental Protection Program precludes a comprehensive program evaluation. In addition, as funds are appropriated, they often lose their identity and become commingled with other funds. Ascertaining how CEPPF funds have been used and attempts to relate benefits to source of funds is thereby impeded.

RECOMMENDATION

If the Legislature desires effective evaluation of the California Environmental Protection Program, we recommend that the Legislature consider requesting the Secretaries of the Resources and the Business and Transportation Agencies to identify and recommend discrete environmental objectives to comprise a program to be financed with net proceeds from personalized license plates sales. Alternatively, the Legislature may wish to consider legislation eliminating the vague restrictions on use of future revenue from personalized license plates and control usage of such funds through normal General Fund appropriations.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FISCAL YEARS JUNE 30, 1971 THROUGH 1978

1. Accounting Policies

Revenues: The revenue figures include amounts accrued as of June 30, on the modified accrual basis. That is, revenues are recorded when received in cash, with only interest receivables and recorded revenue receivables that have been billed and that are estimated to be collected during the following fiscal year being accrued on June 30.

Expenditures: Expenditures include obligations incurred but not paid by June 30, including interfund settlements due but not completed at the end of the fiscal year.

Appropriation expenditures are, in general, recorded currently at the time claims for payment are filed with the State Controller except transfers of money to the Architecture Revolving Fund for capital outlay are recorded as expended at the time of transfer, even though the actual expenditures from that fund may not occur until a later date.

At the end of the fiscal year, all valid encumbrances against appropriations are accrued as expenditures, as provided by law. This requirement results in an overstatement of expenditures and accounts payable to the extent that such encumbrances cover services not yet rendered or goods not yet received.

Surplus: The "Surplus Available for Appropriation" represents the balance of the funds available for new appropriations. "Surplus Available for Appropriation" takes into effect any unencumbered balances of appropriations with continuing availability and other reserves determined in accordance with accepted principles of governmental accounting on a modified accrual basis.

Land, Improvements and Equipment: In general, the values of land, improvements and equipment are carried at acquisition cost in the accounts of the individual state agencies. The State does not maintain a central record of property. These fixed assets are not resources available for appropriation.

2. Public Employees' Retirement System: Most state employees are members of the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS). According to the Report of the State Controller, not all of the actuarial obligation under PERS is currently funded. The CEPPF's portion of the unfunded obligation is unknown.

3. Vacation, Sick Leave and Workers' Compensation Benefits: The accrued liability for vacation, sick leave and workers' compensation benefits is not recorded on the statements. The related expenditures are recorded when paid. The liability for unused vacation at June 30, for the CEPPF is therefore not readily determinable.
