Hate Crime Definition

Any unlawful action designed to frighten, harm, injure, intimidate, or harass an individual, in whole or in part, because of a bias motivation against the actual or perceived race, religion, ethnic / national origin, sexual orientation, gender (including sexual identity /transgender), or disability of the victim.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO

- Protect yourself. Defuse the situation if at all possible. Do not respond to taunts or threats.
- Call 911 immediately. Consult this card and state that you are reporting a hate crime.
- 3. Note the physical descriptions of the suspects in as much detail as possible.
- Write down everything you can remember about the incident, including the time and location.
- 5. File a police report (see other side).
- 6. Get involved. Be a witness if someone else is a victim.
- If you know the suspects, ask about obtaining a restraining order.

REPORTING A HATE CRIME

How to File a Police Report

Emergency: Dial 911 Non-Emergency: Call (760) 327-1441

- Stress that the crime involved hateful words and/or gestures. If you are gay, you do not have to reveal your sexual orientation when reporting the crime. The suspect's perception, whether true or not, is what matters.
- Describe in detail what you heard and saw that made you fearful. Example: "They approached in a menacing manner, called me a (any bigoted slur term) and threatened to kill me." Or, "They drove by, called out a slur, and threw a beer bottle at us."
- Report any incident including property damage or vandalism where hate seems to be a motivation. Even when an incident might not rise to the level of a crime, the incident report will help the police track and identify suspects and prevent future escalations.
- 4. For future reference and follow up, save the report number from the responding officer.

The Palm Springs Police Department gives a high priority to hate crimes and incidents.

Particular attention is given to addressing the safety and concern of victims, their families and others affected by the crime.
